Maxime Alexandre: THE FRENCH MAN ARRIVES TO THE DUTCH CULTURE

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Maxime: Thomas? always with a cigarette (in the mouth or behind the ear or rolling a cigarette)

Narrator: Steph

John: John

Rienk: Rienk

Cosimo:

Magda: Eli

Japan embassy: Toh

French embassy: Steph or someone else who wants to be

Scene 1: Max arrives from the Thalys

Arrival of Max in Amsterdam: straight from the central station, he arrives at the VU and barges into a group meeting that has already started with his suitcase. He interrupts Olga, who is already presenting her work and asks a very long, very complicated question with a very strong French accent.

Maxime: should the positive band at 1777 cm-1 not have a shoulder at 1778 cm-1

People look at him startled.

Olga: Who are you???

Scene 4: Maxime works at night

John: Well, actually, I have an idea...

Max: Oh, really?

Maxime and Cosimo (each at the other side of the room: at home – talking at the same time): incredible after all this time, no news from John! What happened to my papers??!

Scene 9: in the coffee room

Everybody is drinking coffee and chatting.

Cosimo: Hey Max! Have you heard of this really cool conference? It is so nice, so exactly on our topic: IR spectroscopy applied to photoreceptors!!!

Max: Oh yeah! That looks really cool! Where is it????

Cosimo: In Osdorp!

Max: Oh, right, but it's too bad! I'm working the night before that day! (Sarcastic tone)

Magda: Oh, and how about that one on anthropological evolution of Icelandic pygmies societies?

Max: where is it?

Magda: In Japan.

Max: OK! I'm in!;)

Scene 10: Getting ready to go...

Someone passes with a paper that says" one day to go before Japan"

Maxime: He Magda! Going good? Look at my poster! What do you think about?

Magda: Hi Max! I'm more or less fine! Getting super stressed... Impressive your poster! How many figures did you manage to put there? 33! Wow!

Scene 11: Getting ready to finish...

Narrator: Nearly at the end of his contract...

John: He, now that we have this sample holder (lisajo??) for the stepscan, you can start your measurements for my great project! By the way these measurements you did in the beginning, we should check it out, maybe it's worse it to write a paper!

Rienk: He, French man! I see you like difficult set ups! I've got a good news for you: with my super grant that I got in France I need some one to be there for me and set up this new great project of mine!

After starting his post-doc:

Maxime: I **love** science! I **don't** have the laser for the set up and don't get well what is this GREAT CRAZY idea of Rienk but finally I can speak **French**! It makes it much easier!
